We will address: how to choose from among your experiences a moment that shows your growth as a young adult; your capabilities as a prospective freshman in college; how to make specific, personal experiences resonate with a broad audience; and how to select words and a narrative design that will excite a college admissions' officer. We will start the course by looking at a variety of college applications to see the range of topics offered; we will talk about the questions or prompts these schools are asking students to define, and we will discuss how to structure the essay given the topic and the required length. During the course of this week-long session, students will have the opportunity to brainstorm, draft, revise, and finalize essays they can use when applying to universities.
